*Resolved*, That the treasurer of state be, and is hereby authorized to give notes in behalf of the state, payable within three years from the date hereof, for such portions of the loan hereby authorized as may be required.

Approved April 3, 1891.

### Chapter 118.

Resolve to apportion one hundred and fifty-one representatives among the several counties, cities, towns, plantations and classes in the State of Maine.

*Resolved*, That for the sixty-sixth legislature and the succeeding legislatures, to and including that of the year nineteen hundred and one :

The county of Androscoggin shall choose eleven representatives to be apportioned as follows: Lewiston, four; Auburn, two; Lisbon, one; Turner and Livermore, one; East Livermore, Leeds and Greene, one; Poland and Durham, one; Minot, Webster and Wales, one.

The county of Aroostook shall choose twelve representatives to be apportioned as follows: New Limerick, Ludlow, Hammond, Littleton, C, range 2, Monticello, Bridgewater, D, range 2, one; Blaine, Mars Hill, Westfield, E, range 2, 9, range 5, Oxbox, Masardis, Garfield, Ashland, Chapman, Mapleton, Castle Hill, 9, range 3, 9, range 4, 9, range 6, 9, range 7, 10, range 3, 10, range 4, 10, range, 6, 10, range 7, 10, range 8, 11, range 7 and 11, range 3, one; Presque Isle, Easton, one; Fort Fairfield, one; Caribou, one; Wade, Washburn, Perham, Woodland, New Sweden, 15, range 4, Limestone, 16, range 3, 16, range 4, one; Caswell, Connor, Hamlin, Cyr, Van Buren, Grand Isle and 17, range 3, one; Madawaska, Frenchville, 17, range 5 and 17, range 4, one; Fort Kent, New Canada, Wallagrass, Eagle Lake, Winterville, 14, range 7, 14, range 6, Portage Lake, Nashville, Sheridan, St. John, St. Francis, Allagash, 18, range 10, 15, range 11, 16, range 12, 12, range 13, 14, range, 14, 15, range 15, 14, range 16 and all other unorganized townships not included in any other class district, one; Reed, Bancroft, Weston, Haynesville, Glenwood, 3, range, 3, 4, range 3, Orient, Amity, 3, range 2, Cary, A, range 2, Hodgdon, Linneus, one; Houlton, one; Molunkus, Macwahoc, 1,

CHAP. 118 range 4, 1, range 5, Silver Ridge, Benedicta, Sherman, Crystal, Island Falls, Hersey, Dyer Brook, Oakfield, Moro, Merrill, Smyrna, 7, range 5, 8, range 5, 2, range 4, 3, range 4, 7, range 3, 8, range 3, 7, range 4 and 8, range 4, one.

The county of Cumberland shall choose twenty-one representatives to be apportioned as follows: Portland, six; Cape Elizabeth, one; Westbrook, one; Deering, one; Brunswick, one; Gorham, one; Bridgton, one; Windham and Pownal, one; Freeport, one; Casco, Otisfield and Harrison, one; Baldwin and Standish, one; Gray and New Gloucester, one; Falmouth and Cumberland, one; Sebago, Naples and Raymond, one; Yarmouth and North Yarmouth, one; Scarborough, for the years eighteen hundred and ninety-three, eighteen hundred and ninety-seven and nineteen hundred and one, Harpswell for the years eighteen hundred and ninety-five and eighteen hundred and ninety-nine, one. Scarborough shall choose one in the years eighteen hundred and ninety-four and eighteen hundred and ninety-eight, if by reason of an amendment of the constitution, annual and regular sessions of the legislature shall be held in those years. Harpswell shall choose one in the years eighteen hundred and ninety-six and nineteen hundred if, for the same reason, such session shall be held in those years.

The county of Franklin shall choose four representatives to be apportioned as follows: Farmington and New Sharon, one; Wilton, Jay, Carthage and Chesterville, one; Avon, Strong, Phillips, Salem, Weld, Temple, Perkins plantation, Washington plantation, Number Six plantation, and Letter E plantation, one; Kingfield, Rangeley, New Vineyard, Freeman, Eustis, Madrid, Industry, Rangeley plantation, Greenvale plantation, Coplin plantation, Dallas and all other territory in the county of Franklin not included in any other district, one. The town of Phillips is authorized to elect a representative for the years eighteen hundred and ninety-three, eighteen hundred and ninety-four, nineteen hundred and one and nineteen hundred and two.

The county of Hancock shall choose nine representatives to be apportioned as follows: Ellsworth, one; Bucksport and Verona, one; Orland, Castine and Brooksville, one; Bluehill, Surry and Dedham, one; Mount Desert, Eden, Tremont and Cranberry Isle, one; Deer Isle, Swans Island and all other islands in said county not included in any other district, one;

Gouldsboro, Sullivan, Franklin, Eastbrook and townships and plantations, numbers seven, eight, nine, ten and twenty-one, one; Trenton, Lamoine, Hancock, Waltham, Mariaville, Otis, Amherst, Aurora, plantation number thirty-three, and all other plantations and townships not included in any other district, one; Penobscot, Sedgwick, Brooklin and Long Island plantation, one.

The county of Kennebec shall choose thirteen representatives to be apportioned as follows: Augusta, two; Clinton, Winslow and Benton, one; Belgrade, Rome and Winthrop, one; Mount Vernon, Vienna, Readfield and Fayette, one; Waterville, one; Vassalborough and Windsor, one; Randolph, Pittston, Farmingdale and West Gardiner, one; Gardiner, one; Manchester, Oakland and Sidney, one; China, Albion, Chelsea and Unity plantation, one; Wayne, Monmouth and Litchfield, one; Hallowell, one.

The county of Knox shall choose eight representatives to be apportioned as follows: Washington, Appleton and Hope, one; Rockland, two; South Thomaston, Vinalhaven, North Haven and Hurricane Isle, one; Union and Warren, one; Camden, eighteen hundred and ninety-five and eighteen hundred and ninety-nine; Rockport, eighteen hundred and ninety-three and eighteen hundred and ninety-seven, one; St. George, Cushing and Friendship, one; Thomaston, plantations of Matinicus Isle and Muscle Ridge, one.

The county of Lincoln shall choose five representatives to be apportioned as follows: Boothbay Harbor, Southport, Westport and Wiscasset, one; Dresden, Whitefield, Jefferson and Bremen, one; Boothbay, Alna, Newcastle and Nobleborough, one; Waldoborough and Edgecomb, one; Bristol, Damariscotta, Somerville and Monhegan, one.

The county of Oxford shall choose six representatives to be apportioned as follows: Porter, Brownfield, Fryeburg, Hiram and Lovell, one; Stow, Denmark, Stoneham, Sweden, Waterford, Albany, Woodstock, Mason, Gilead and Fryeburg Academy and Batchelder's grant, one; Bethel, Hanover Newry, Grafton, Upton, Riley, Lincoln and Magalloway plantations, Andover and North and West Surplus, Rumford and all territory not otherwise included, one; Mexico, Roxbury, Byron, Dixfield, Peru and Franklin plantation, Milton plantation, Canton and Sumner, one; Norway, Oxford,

The county of Penobscot shall choose seventeen representatives to be apportioned as follows: Bangor, three; Brewer, one; Old Town, one; Mount Chase, Patten, Staceyville plantation, Medway, Woodville plantation, Mattawamkeag, Chester, and all other territory not specifically classed, one; Kingman, Prentiss, Winn, Springfield, Carroll, Drew plantation, Webster plantation, and Lakeville plantation, one; Lincoln, Lee, Burlington, Lowell, Grand Falls plantation, No. 1 plantation, and No. 3, range 1, east of Burlington, one. The town of Lincoln is authorized to elect a representative for the years eighteen hundred and ninety-three, eighteen hundred and ninety-four, eighteen hundred and ninety-five and eighteen hundred and ninety-six. Passadumkeag, Mattamiscontis, Maxfield, Enfield, Howland, Edinburg, Lagrange, Argyle, Alton, Greenbush, Seboeis plantation, one; Milford, Greenfield, Eddington, Holden, Clifton, Veazie, one; Orono, Bradley, one; Orrington, Hampden, one; Bradford, Hudson, Charleston, Corinth, Kenduskeag, one; Carmel, Glenburn, Hermon, Levant, one; Dixmont, Newburg, Plymouth, Etna, Stetson, one; Newport, Corinna, Exeter, one; Dexter, Garland, one.

The county of Piscataquis shall choose four representatives to be apportioned as follows: Wellington, Kingsbury plantation, Blanchard, Shirley, Monson, Greenville, Squaw Mountain, Gore A, No. 2, Day's Academy Grant, Township A, range 14, W. E. L. S., Township one, range 13, W. E. L. S., East Middlesex Grant, Township 3, East Kennebec, A, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, range 13, W. E. L. S., 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, range 14, W. E. L. S., X, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, range 15, W. E. L. S., including Grant Farm, Chesuncook and N. E. Carry, Willimantic, Elliottsville plantation, one; Parkman, Sangerville, Dover, one; Sebec, Barnard plantation, Bowerbank plantation, Foxcroft, Guilford, Abbot, one; Brownville, Katahdin Iron Works plantation, Williamsburg, Township 5, range 9, N. W. P. East College township, West College township, Atkinson, Orneville, Medford, Milo, Township 4, range 9, one.

The county of Sagadahoc shall choose four representatives to be apportioned as follows: Bath, two; Richmond, Bow-

doinham, Bowdoin and Perkins, one ; Georgetown, Woolwich, CHAP. 118  
Arrowsic, Phippsburg, West Bath and Topsham, one.

The county of Somerset shall choose seven representatives to be apportioned as follows : Skowhegan, one ; Fairfield, Smithfield and Mercer, one ; Norridgewock, Starks, Anson and New Portland, one ; Madison, Solon, Athens and Cornville, one ; Pittsfield, Canaan, Palmyra and Detroit, one ; Saint Albans, Ripley, Cambridge and Harmony, one ; Bingham, Embden, Brighton, Concord, Moscow and all plantations, one.

The county of Waldo shall choose six representatives to be apportioned as follows : Belfast, one ; Prospect, Stockton Springs, Searsport and Swanville, one ; Winterport, Frankfort, Monroe and Brooks, one ; Burnham, Unity, Thorndike, Jackson, Troy and Knox, one ; Searsmont, Lincolnville, Belmont, Northport and Islesborough, one ; Palermo, Freedom, Liberty, Montville, Waldo and Morrill, one.

The county of Washington shall choose ten representatives to be apportioned as follows : Cherryfield, Steuben, Milbridge, Deblois, Beddington, Devereux, one ; Harrington, Columbia Falls, Columbia, Addison, one ; Machias, Jonesborough, Roque Bluffs, Centerville, Whitneyville, Northfield, Wesley, one ; East Machias, Marshfield, Townships Number 14, 18, 19, Crawford, Marion, Whiting, Dennysville, Edmunds, one ; Pembroke, Charlotte, Meddybemps, Cooper ; Alexander, Robbinston, one ; Lubec, Perry, Trescott, one ; Jonesport, Machiasport, Cutler, one ; Eastport, one ; Calais, one ; Princeton, Danforth, Vanceboro, Baileyville, Baring, Topsfield, Brookton, Waite, Forest City, Kossuth, Codyville, Grand Lake, Talmadge, Lambert Lake, Township Number 21, one.

The county of York shall choose fourteen representatives to be apportioned as follows : Biddeford, two ; Saco, one ; Sanford, one ; Parsonsfield, Cornish and Newfield, one ; Waterborough, Shapleigh and Limerick, one ; Alfred, Lyman and Limington, one ; North Berwick, Lebanon and Acton, one ; Buxton and Hollis, one ; Kennebunk and Dayton, one ; South Berwick and Old Orchard, one ; Berwick and Wells, one ; Kennebunkport and York, one ; Kittery and Eliot one ; Kittery to be represented for the years eighteen hundred and ninety-three, eighteen hundred and ninety-seven, and nineteen hundred and one ; Eliot to be represented for

the years eighteen hundred and ninety-five and eighteen hundred and ninety-nine, said towns to vote together for each representative.

### Chapter 119.

Resolve for an appropriation for the extirpation of Contagious Diseases among Cattle.

Extirpation of contagious diseases among cattle, in favor of.

*Resolved*, That the sum of twenty-five hundred dollars is hereby appropriated to carry into effect the provisions of the law for the extirpation of contagious diseases among cattle, for the year eighteen hundred and ninety-one, and twenty-five hundred dollars for the year eighteen hundred and ninety-two, to be expended under direction of the cattle commissioners.

Approved April 3, 1891.

### Chapter 120.

Resolve making an appropriation for repairs on State Arsenal at Bangor.

State arsenal, repair of, in favor of.

*Resolved*, That the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars be and hereby is appropriated for repairs to be made on the state arsenal at Bangor; the said sum to be expended under direction of the governor and council.

Approved April 3, 1891.

### Chapter 121.

Resolve in favor of the abatement of the State and County Taxes on Washington Plantation

Washington plantation, county tax, abatement of.

*Resolved*, That the state and county taxes assessed on Washington plantation, so called, in the county of Franklin, now due and unpaid, amounting to two hundred and seventy-eight dollars and seventy cents, be and hereby are abated.
