CHAP. 209**Chapter 209.**

An Act to amend Section twenty-three, Chapter one hundred sixteen of the Revised Statutes, relating to the regulation of fees and costs.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sec. 23, ch. 116,
R. S., amended.

SECT. 1. Section twenty-three of chapter one hundred sixteen of the revised statutes is hereby amended, so as to read as follows:

Fees of town
clerks.

‘SECT. 23. For entering and recording intentions of marriage, giving certificate of same, and recording marriage on receiving the minister’s or justice’s certificate thereof, one dollar to be paid on issuing the certificate of intention. For recording births and deaths, ten cents each. For a certificate of a birth or death, ten cents. For recording sheep marks, ten cents.’

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 210.

An Act to amend Section fifty-nine of Chapter three of the Revised Statutes relating to Powers of Towns.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sec. 59, ch. 3,
R. S., amended.

Section fifty-nine of chapter three of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding at the end of the paragraph six of said section the following words: ‘And for the proper protection and care of public parks and squares within the same and all monuments, statues and erections thereon’ so that said paragraph of said section as thus amended, shall read as follows:

Sidewalks,
planting trees,
and protection of
parks, etc.

‘VI. For setting off portions of their streets for side walks and keeping them clear of snow and other obstructions and for planting and preserving trees by the side thereof, and for the proper protection and care of public parks and squares within the same and all monuments, statues and erections thereon.’
