Chapter 245.

An Act to regulate the duties of Recording Officers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Recording officer shall not draft or aid in drafting any kind of conveyance or document he is required to record.

—penalty.

SECT. 1. No city, county or state officer whose duty it is to record conveyances of any kind, assignments, certificates or other documents or papers whatsoever, shall draft or aid in drafting any conveyance, assignment, certificate or other document or paper which he is by law required to record, in full or in part; under a penalty of not exceeding one hundred dollars, to be recovered by any complainant by action of debt for his benefit or by indictment for the benefit of the county.

SECT. 2. All statutes inconsistent with this act, are hereby repealed.

Chapter 246.

An Act to regulate practice in Courts of Probate and Insolvency.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Registers shall make entries of each motion, etc.

Registers of probate in all probate and insolvency cases shall, under the appropriate heading of each case, make entries of each motion, order, decree and proceeding, so that at all times the docket shall show the exact status of each case.
