### COW MOOSE.

All acts and part of acts inconsistent with this SECT. 9. act, are hereby repealed.

This act shall take effect when approved. SECT. 10.

Approved March 22, 1893

#### Chapter 250.

An Act to amend Section nine, Chapter ninety-five of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred ninety one, relating to the close time on Cow Moose.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Section nine, chapter ninety-five of the public laws of eighteen hundred ninety-one, is hereby amended by striking out all of said section after the figure "nine," and inserting the following words, 'whoever hunts, catches, kills or destroys with dogs any moose, forfeits one hundred dollars for every moose so hunted, caught, killed or destroyed, and no person shall, between the first days of January and October in any manuer hunt, eatch, kill or destroy, or have in possession, any moose or part thereof, taken in close time, under the same penalty,' so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows:

'SECT. 9. Whoever hunts, catches, kills or destroys with dogs, any moose, forfeits one hundred dollars for every moose so hunted, caught, killed or destroyed, and no person shall between the first days of January and October in any manner hunt, catch, kill, destroy or have in possession any moose or part thereof taken in close time, under the same penalty.'

SECT. 2. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this Inconsistent act, are hereby repealed.
