CHAP. 263**Chapter 263.**

An Act to amend Section ten, Chapter one hundred and three of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred ninety one, relating to salaries of State Board of Assessors.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Sec. 10, ch. 103,
Pub. Laws, 1891,
amended.

Section ten, chapter one hundred and three of the public laws of eighteen hundred and ninety one, is hereby amended, so as to read as follows :

Assessors shall
be provided with
rooms, etc.

‘SECT. 10. Said state assessors shall be provided with suitable rooms in the state house, and shall be furnished by the secretary of state with necessary books, blanks, stationery, notices and summonses, and may employ such clerical assistance as they shall deem necessary, at an expense not exceeding one thousand dollars per annum.’

Chapter 264.

An Act to amend Section two of Chapter one hundred fifteen of Revised Statutes, relating to the Salary of the County Attorney of Cumberland county.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Salary of county
attorney of Cum-
berland county,
fixed.

From and after the first day of January, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, the salary of the county attorney for the county of Cumberland, shall be twelve hundred dollars a year.
