CHAP. 270

Chapter 270.

An Act additional to Chapter thirty-two of the Revised Statutes, relating to Notaries Public, Protests, Days of Grace and Demand on Notes and Bills.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Powers of notaries public, enlarged.

Any official act which may be performed by a justice of the peace and quorum, may be performed by a notary public.

Approved March 28, 1893.

Chapter 271.

An Act to amend Chapter six of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven, relating to County Law Libraries.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Ch. 6, Pub. Laws, 1887, further amended.

SECT. 1. Chapter six of the public laws of the year eighteen hundred and eighty-seven as amended by chapter two hundred and twenty-one of the public laws of the year eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, is hereby amended so that said section as amended, shall read as follows :

Twenty per cent of all fines, to be set apart for benefit of county law libraries.

‘SECT. 1. The treasurer of each county shall pay to the treasurer of the Law Library Association of his county for the use and benefit of the county law library, twenty per cent of all funds actually paid into the county treasury for the violation of any of the provisions of chapter twenty-seven and of section one of chapter seventeen of the revised statutes, providing, however, that the sum so paid by the county treasurer shall not exceed five hundred dollars per annum.’

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Approved March 28, 1893.
