### Снар. 357

#### Chapter 357.

An Act to amend the charter of the Rockland, Thomaston and Camden Street
Railway.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Company, au thoriz d to construct a street railroad from Thomasion to Warren. SECT. 1. The Rockland, Thomaston and Camden Street Railway is hereby authorized to construct, operate and maintain a street railroad from Thomaston to, into and through the town of Warren, subject to all the restrictions and limitations of its existing charter and with all the powers and privileges thereby conferred.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

#### Chapter 358.

An Act to prohibit the taking of fish from Webb's Pond, its tributaries and outlet, in Franklin County.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Taking of fish from tributaries of Webb's pond, prohibited. SECT. 1. All persons are hereby prohibited from taking fish of any kind, excepting minnows for bait, during the fishing season, from the tributaries of Webb's pond.

Close time for outlet, extended.

SECT. 2. The close time for the outlet of Webb's pond is hereby extended, so as to include the month of September in each year, in addition to the general close time as now provided by law.

Penalty for violation.

SECT. 3. Any person violating the provisions of the foregoing sections of this act, shall be liable to a fine of five dollars for each fish so taken, to be recovered on complaint before any trial justice in the county of Franklin, one-half to the complainant, and one-half to the town where the offense is committed.

Taking of fish, through the ice, prohibited. SECT. 4. All persons are hereby prohibited from taking fish of any kind, in any manner, through the ice, in Webb's pond in the town of Weld.

Penalty.

SECT. 5. Any person violating the provisions of section four of this act, shall be liable to a fine of ten dollars, and a further penalty of one dollar for each fish so taken, to be

recovered on complaint before any trial justice in the county Chap. 359 of Franklin, one-half to the complainant and one-half to the town of Weld.

Sect. 6. This act shall take effect when approved.

### Chapter 359.

An Act to incorporate the Rumford Falls Trust Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. George D. Bisbee, Waldo Pettengill, Hugh J. Cornorators. Chisholm, Daniel F. Emery, Fred E. Richards, Stanley Bisbee, John S Harlow, Addison E. Herrick and Oscar II. Hersey, or such of them as may by vote accept this charter, with their associates, successors and assigns, are hereby made a body corporate and politic, to be known as the Rumford Falls Trust Company, and as such shall be possessed of all corporate name. the powers, privileges and immunities, and subject to all the duties and obligations conferred on corporations by law, except as otherwise provided herein.

SECT. 2. The corporation hereby created shall be located Location. at Rumford Falls, Rumford, Oxford county, Maine.

SECT. 3. The purposes of said corporation and the busi- Purposes. ness which it may perform, are: first, to receive on deposit, money, coin, bank notes, evidences of debt, accounts of individuals, companies, corporations, municipalities and states, allowing interest thereon, if agreed, or as the by-laws of said corporation may provide; second, to borrow money; to loan money on credits or real estate or personal security, and to negotiate loans and sales for others; to guarantee the payment of the principal and interest of all obligations secured by mortgages of real estate running to said Rumford Falls Trust Company; to issue its own bonds or obligations based upon real or personal property conveyed to it in trust, to secure the payment of such bonds or obligations and the interest thereon; third, to hold for safe keeping all kinds of personal or mixed property, and to act as agents for the owners thereof, and of real estate for the collection of income on the same,
