#### Снар. 360

#### Chapter 360.

An Act to authorize and empower the Islesboro' Land and Improvement Company to erect and maintain a breakwater or dyke across the mouth of Dark Harbor at Islesboro', Waldo County, Maine.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Company, authorized to erect a breakwater in Islesboro.

- Sect. 1. The Islesboro' Land and Improvement Company, a corporation by law duly established and having its place of business at Islesboro', Waldo county, Maine, and its location at Rockland, Maine, is hereby authorized and empowered to erect and maintain across the mouth of Dark Harbor, in said Islesboro', a solid breakwater or dyke in tide waters on opposite sides of said harbor, from shore to shore, and extending such distance above tide water as may be deemed desirable, with an opening therein of not less than fourteen feet in width, provided with such gates as may be requisite to let the tide waters into and retain the same at will in said Dark Harbor, at such place, extending from land of said company on the opposite shores of said harbor as said company may determine. Said breakwater or dyke to be constructed of such size and materials and in such manner as said company may determine.
- SECT. 2. Said company is hereby authorized to construct and maintain a solid breakwater or dyke in tide waters, from shore to shore on opposite sides, across the mouth of Dark Harbor, in said Islesboro', with an opening therein of fourteen feet and six inches, provided with gates to let the tide water into and retain the same at will in said harbor, in substantially the same place, being about one thousand one hundred and fifty feet from the head of said harbor, and in substantially the same manner in which a breakwater or dyke has been, and is now, constructed and maintained across the mouth of said harbor by said company.
  - SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
