Amounting to the sum of one million one hundred forty-eight thousand thirty-eight dollars and fifty cents, \$1,148,038 50 Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 367.

An Act to prohibit fishing through the ice in Sandy River Ponds and Long Pond in Franklin County.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Fishing through the ice, in Sandy river ponds, prohibited for six years. SECT. 1. All persons are hereby prohibited from fishing in any manner through the ice in any of the Sandy river ponds in Sandy river plantation, so called, and Long pond in Sandy river plantation and Greenvale plantation, so called, in Franklin county, for six years.

Penalty, for

SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions of this act shall be liable to a penalty of ten dollars for the offense, and a further penalty of one dollar for each fish so taken, to be recovered on complaint before any trial justice or other court in said county of Franklin, one half to the use of the complainant, and the other half to the use of said county.

Act, shall be published in Farmington Chronicle.

When act shall take effect.

SECT. 3. The secretary of state shall cause a copy of this act to be published in the Farmington Chronicle two weeks.

SECT. 4. This act shall take effect February twenty, eighteen hundred and ninety-three.
