CHAP. 374

Chapter 374.

An Act authorizing the Waters Wrapping and Mailing Machine Company to hold stock and bonds of other corporations engaged in similar business.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Waters Wrap-
ping and Mailing
Machine Com-
pany authorized
to hold stock,
etc., of other
corporations.

SECT. 1. The Waters Wrapping and Mailing Machine Company, organized under the general laws of this state, is hereby authorized and empowered to purchase, hold, own, sell and use the stock, bonds and property of other corporations, organized under the laws of this state and other states, engaged in or relating to, or necessary for the business described in the articles of agreement and certificate of organization of said Waters Wrapping and Mailing Machine Company, and may vote upon said stock in such manner or by such agents as may be determined by the stockholders or directors of said Waters Wrapping and Mailing Machine Company.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 375.

An Act authorizing the Umbagog Pulp Company to hold stock and bonds of other corporations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows .

Doings of Um-
bagog Pulp
Company, made
valid.

SECT. 1. The Umbagog Pulp Company, a corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the state of Maine, which organization is hereby ratified, confirmed and declared to be legal and valid, is hereby authorized and empowered to acquire, hold and dispose of shares of capital stock and mortgage bonds of other corporations.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
