CHAP. 378**Chapter 378.**

An Act authorizing the Otis Falls Pulp Company to hold stock and bonds of other Corporations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Organization of
Otis Falls Pulp
Company, rat-
ified.

SECT. 1. The Otis Falls Pulp Company, a corporation duly organized under the laws of the state of Maine, which organization is hereby ratified, confirmed and declared to be legal and valid, is hereby authorized and empowered to acquire, hold and dispose of shares of capital stock and mortgage bonds of other corporations.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 379.

An Act in reference to the value of the shares of the Eastman Freight Car Heater Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Eastman
Freight Car
Heater Com-
pany, authorized
to change par
value of stock.

SECT. 1. The Eastman Freight Car Heater Company, a corporation duly established under the laws of the state of Maine, is hereby authorized to change the par value of its stock from five dollars a share to one hundred dollars a share, so that the shares of said corporation, instead of being one hundred thousand shares of the par value of five dollars each, shall be five thousand shares of the par value of one hundred dollars each. Such change shall be effected whenever a majority of the stockholders of said corporation shall, at a meeting legally called for that purpose, so vote.
