This section shall apply to the funds now on CHAP. 385 such contracts. deposit, but in no case shall the reserve fund be reduced to a sum less than the amount of one full assessment upon all the deposit. members of the association for the time being."

Chapter 385.

An Act authorizing the Bangor Boom Company to erect a pier in Penobscot River.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The Bangor Boom Company is hereby authorized to erect and maintain within its limits on the westerly side of Penobscot river, a pier nearly opposite the northerly soot river. line of Daniel Webster's farm, and to be within three hundred feet from the westerly bank of the river; said pier to be located, to be of such size and proportions, and to be constructed as shall be determined by Joab W. Palmer and William Connors, of Bangor.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 386

An Act to amend section two of chapter five hundred and seventy four, Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and fifty-six, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Kendall's Mills Village Corporation" and all acts amendatory thereto.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Section two of said act as amended by chapter one hundred thirty-nine, private and special laws of eighteen hundred ninety-one by striking out the word "and" in the twelfth line and adding to said section at the end thereof, the further following words : 'and for purchasing land for and maintaining burial grounds,' so that said section as amended, shall read :

better security of life and property, and for the promotion of good order, and the observance of the laws within its limits, for purchasing and keeping in repair engines and other apparatus for the extingnishment of fires, for the construction of reservoirs and aqueducts to supply water, for the erection and keeping in repair suitable engine honses, for organizing and maintaining an efficient fire department, for ringing the bell, for constructing and maintaining public sewers within said corporation limits, and for purchasing land for and maintaining burial grounds.'

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 387.

An Act to amend the charter of the Provident Aid Society.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Section two of chapter five hundred and five of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and eightyfive is hereby amended, so as to read as follows:

'SECT. 2. Said corporation may purchase, take and hold by deed, gift, bequest, devise or otherwise, real and personal estate, for the purposes of said corporation, to the amount of five hundred thousand dollars in value.'

SECT. 2. Section four of chapter five hundred five of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred eighty-five as amended by chapter one hundred eighty-four of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred eighty-seven and chapter three hundred eighty-two of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred eighty-nine, is hereby further amended, so as to read as follows:

'SECT. 4. Said corporation shall, upon the thirty-first day of December of each year, have on deposit in the state treasury, for the benefit and protection of its certificate holders, a fund equal to one death assessment on all its members, and if said corporation shall neglect for sixty days to satisfy any judgment recovered against it in any court in this state, upon any certificate issued by it, the treasurer of state may apply said fund to the satisfaction of said judgment, and said
