Chapter 433.

An Act authorizing the W. H. Parsons and Company to hold stock and bonds of other corporations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The W. H. Parsons and Company, a corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the state of Maine, which organization is hereby ratified, confirmed and declared to be legal and valid, is hereby authorized and empowered to acquire, hold and dispose of shares of capital stock and mortgage bonds of other corporations.

Organization ratified, and company authorized to hold stock, etc., of other corporations.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 434.

An Act to legalize and make valid the doings of Gorham Library Association and enable it to become a free public library.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The acts and doings of the Gorham Library Association in its organization, its meetings, election of officers and records, in acquiring and selling and conveying real estate, and all other proceedings, not contrary to the laws of the state, are hereby confirmed and made valid, notwithstanding any informalities in its past proceedings and records.

Doings of Gorham Library Association, made valid.

SECT. 2. All the powers, immunities, franchises, property and affairs of said Gorham Library Association shall hereafter perpetually be held, exercised, managed and governed by a permanent board to be styled the trustees of Gorham Library Association, and said corporate property shall be used, improved and applied for a free public library for the citizens of the town of Gorham, and shall be forever exempt from liability to be taken by said town from the management, direction and custody of said board of trustees.

SECT. 3. Said board of trustees shall consist of not less than nine nor more than fifteen members, two-thirds of whom, at least, shall be citizens of said town of Gorham ; and shall in the first instance be composed of the following persons : John A. Waterman, George W. Reynolds, Edward C. Strout,
