#### Chanter 471.

An Act to extend the charter of the Proprietors of Sheepscot River Toll Bridge.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The charter of the proprietors of the Sheepscot Charter of River Toll Bridge, which was granted in the year of our Sherpsoot River T ll Lord seventeen hundred ninety-three, by the legislature of ovended one ovended one Massachusetts, and which was extended for thirty years by the legislature of Maine, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred sixty-two, and which expires June twenty-two, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred ninety-three, is hereby extended for the space of one year.

SECT. 2. This act however, shall not interfere with any subsequent act of the legislature which may give authority to the county commissioners of Lincoln county to lay out a highway and free bridge across said toll bridge, to connect the towns of Newcastle and Alna.

Act, not to interfere with authority of commis ioners of Lincoln county.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

#### Chapter 472.

An Act to consolidate and amend Chapter two hundred and five of the Special Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven, Chapters three hundred and fiftyseven, three hundred and eighty-seven and five hundred and forty-one of the Special Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-nine, and Chapter two hundred and fifty-one of the Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-one, relating to the Bangor Municipal Court.

B. it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sect. 1. The Bangor Municipal Court shall continue to be a court of record and have and use a seal on all original pal oourt. processes, and consist of one judge and a clerk who shall be appointed, commissioned and qualified in the manner provided by the constitution of this state. The present judge and the recorder, who shall hereafter be styled clerk, shall continue in office until the end of the terms for which they were and recorder, to continue in respectively appointed.

SECT. 2. Said court shall exercise jurisdiction over all Jurisdiction. such matters and things, civil and criminal, within the county
