Chapter 505.

An Act to amend section two of chapter two hundred and one of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and fifty-four, relating to the powers of the Bridgton Centre Village Corporation.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Section two of chapter two hundred and one of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and fifty-four is hereby amended by adding thereto the following words: 'for the construction and repairing of sidewalks, sewers and a general sewerage system, for lighting the streets, and for furnishing one or more police officers, night watchman, or other officers, within the limits of said corporation. Said corporation is also invested with power to receive, hold and manage devises, bequests and gifts, and shall so hold and manage the same for any of the purposes of the corporation,' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

Sec. 2, ch. 201,

SECT. 2. Said corporation is hereby invested with the power at any legal meeting called for the purpose, to raise such sums of money as may be sufficient for the purchase, repair and preservation of one or more fire engines, engine house, hose, buckets, ladders and other apparatus for the extinguishment of fire, for the construction of reservoirs, and aqueducts, for the procuring of water for fire purposes, and for organizing within the limits of said territory an efficient fire department, for the construction and repair of sidewalks, sewers and a general sewerage system, for lighting the streets, and for furnishing one or more police officers, night watchman, or other officers, within the limits of said corporation. Said corporation is also invested with power to receive, hold and manage devises, bequests and gifts, and shall so hold and manage the same for any of the purposes of the corporation.'

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
