CHAP. 520**Chapter 520.**

An Act to amend Chapter two hundred and sixty-six of the laws of eighteen hundred sixty-seven, relating to the Camden Village Corporation.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sec. 1, ch. 266,
acts of 1867,
amended.

SECT. 1. Section one of chapter two hundred and sixty-six, acts of eighteen hundred sixty-seven, is hereby amended, by inserting after the word "Camden" in said section, the words 'excepting so much of said school district as is now within the limits of the town of Rockport,' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

Territory.

'SECT. 1. The territory embraced within the limits of Megunticook school district in the town of Camden, excepting so much of said school district as is now within the limits of the town of Rockport, together with the inhabitants thereon, be and the same is hereby created a body politic and corporate, by the name of the Camden Village Corporation.'

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 521.

An Act to supply the people of South Gardiner Village, in the city of Gardiner, with pure water.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Corporators.

SECT. 1. Sherburn Lawrence, Hiram Lawrence, Greenleaf Lawrence, Charles Lawrence and Van R. Beedle, with their associates and successors are hereby made a corporation by the name of South Gardiner Water Company for the purpose of conveying to and supplying pure water in the present limits of ward six in the city of Gardiner.

May hold real

SECT. 2. Said corporation, for said purposes, may hold real and personal estate necessary and convenient therefor, not exceeding sixty thousand dollars.

Authorized to
take water and
lay down pipes.

SECT. 3. Said corporation is hereby authorized, for the purposes aforesaid, to take and use the water of the Kennebec river, and is also authorized to lay down and maintain pipes and aqueducts necessary for the proper accumulating, conducting, discharging, distributing and disposing of water,
