SECT. 4. All deeds of real estate heretofore given to the bishop of the Protestant Episcopal Church in the diocese of Maine, and his successors in said office, are hereby declared declared valid. to be valid instruments, and to vest the title to the estate therein described in the said bishop and his successors as a corporation sole as aforesaid; and all the effect and force intended by the parties to any such deed shall be given thereto, according to the purport and provisions thereof.

Chapter 535.

An Act to make valid the doings of the Plantation of Westfield, in Aroostook County.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The annual meeting of the plantation of Westfield, in Aroostook county, held in the month of March, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and ninetytwo, and all the acts of the said plantation in electing officers, raising money and other matters done under the articles in the warrant calling said meeting are hereby legalized and made valid; and especially and particularly the following mistakes and defects. The chairman of the board of assessors called the meeting to order and presided until a moderator was chosen, the law requiring that the clerk should call the meeting to order. This action of the chairman of the board of assessors, as well as all acts subsequently done at this meeting are hereby made legal and valid.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
