#### ORONO WATER COMPANY.

#### Chapter 542.

An Act to amend an act entitled "An Act to incorporate the Orono Water Company."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. Chapter two hundred and twenty-six of the pri- Ch. 220 Special Law. vate and special laws enacted by the sixty-fifth session of the amended. legislature of Maine, is amended by adding the following section, after section twelve :

SECT. 13. The doings of the inhabitants of the town of Doings of town Orono at a special meeting of said inhabitants held on the valid. fourteenth day of July, eighteen hundred and ninety-two are hereby made valid, and the committee appointed by said meeting with authority to contract for a system of water works for said town, are hereby vested with full authority to carry out the instructions of said town meeting. Said committee may contract with any persons or corporations for such -committee, purposes, and may bind said town for the payment of such water works. sums as annual rental of hydrants for protection against fire, and for other purposes, as they may see fit. Should said committee contract for the construction and operation of said water works with any person or corporation other than said Orono Water Company, then said Orono Water Company may, by agreement, take an assignment of such contract with all the rights, privileges and duties given or imposed by this act, or by such contract.'

SECT. 2. All acts or parts of acts inconsistent with this Inconsistent act, are hereby repealed.

This act shall take effect when approved. SECT. 3.
