CHAP. 558 time and place of such meeting in any daily paper printed in Bangor. Such notice to be so published, at least seven days prior to such meeting, which must be held in Bangor.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 558.

An Act to amend an act to authorize the sale of the Ministerial and School Lands in the town of New Sharon, and to incorporate certain persons by the name of the Trustees of the Ministerial and School Funds in the town of New Sharon.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section two of chapter one hundred and eight of the private and special laws of the commonwealth of Massachusetts, approved February twelve, one thousand eight hundred and twelve, as respects this state, is hereby amended by adding to said section the following words, 'and may hold real and personal estate conveyed to them in trust for the uses and purposes of a public library for the use of the town of New Sharon, Maine, and manage and control the same effectually for said purposes in addition to all other matters they can now do by law,' so that said section shall read as follows:

Corporate name.

SECT. 2. Be it further enacted, that the trustees before named be, and they are hereby incorporated into a body politic by the name of the trustees of the ministerial and school funds in the town of New Sharon, and that they and their successors shall be, and continue a body politic and corporate forever, and they shall have and use a common seal subject to alteration at their pleasure, and by the name aforesaid they may sue and be sued in all actions, real, personal and mixed, and prosecute and defend the same to final judgment and execution, and may hold real and personal estate conveyed to them in trust for the uses and purposes of a public library for the use of the town of New Sharon, Maine, and manage and control the same effectually for said purposes in addition to all other matters they can now do by law.'
