**Chapter 571.**

An Act for the protection of Trout in the tributaries of Parlin Pond and Lang Pond in Somerset County.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. No fish of any kind shall be taken from the inlets of Parlin and Lang ponds, or from Parlin or Lang streams or their tributaries, for the term of five years from the first day of May, eighteen hundred and ninety-three.

Taking of fish from Parlin and Lang ponds, for five years, prohibited.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions of this act shall be liable to a penalty of ten dollars for the offense and a further penalty of one dollar for each fish so taken, to be recovered on complaint before any trial justice in Somerset county.

Penalty.

Approved March 27, 1893.

**Chapter 572.**

An Act additional to chapter one hundred and sixty-four of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-one, relating to the taking of Trout and land-locked Salmon from Anasagunticook Lake in the towns of Canton and Hartford.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. All persons are hereby prohibited from taking fish of any kind from the tributaries of Anasagunticook lake or Whitney pond, so called, in Canton and Hartford, for a term of six years.

Taking of fish from Whitney pond, for six years, prohibited.

SECT. 2. Any person violating the provisions of the foregoing section of this act shall be liable to a fine of five dollars for each fish so taken, to be recovered on complaint before any trial justice in the county of Oxford, one-half to the complainant and one-half to the town where the offense is committed.

Penalty.

SECT. 3. All persons are prohibited hereby from taking fish of any kind, in any manner, through the ice in Anasagunticook lake or Whitney pond, so called, in the towns of Canton and Hartford, for a term of six years.

Taking of fish through ice, prohibited.

SECT. 4. Any person violating the provisions of section three of this act shall be liable to a fine of ten dollars, and a further penalty of one dollar for each fish so taken, to be

recovered on complaint before any trial justice in the county of Oxford, one-half to the complainant and one-half to the town of Canton.

Approved March 27, 1893.

**Chapter 573.**

An Act for the protection of fish in King and Bartlett Lakes, in King and Bartlett Township in Somerset county.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Taking of fish in King and Bartlett lakes, for four years, prohibited.

SECT. 1. All persons are hereby prohibited from taking fish of any kind, in any manner through the ice in King and Bartlett lakes, known as Big King and Little King, or either of them, in King and Bartlett township, in Somerset county, for the term of four years from the date of the approval of this act.

Penalty.

SECT. 2. Any person who shall violate the provisions of this act shall be liable to a penalty of ten dollars for the offense, and a further penalty of one dollar for each fish so taken, to be recovered on complaint before any trial justice in Somerset county, one half to the use of the complainant and the other half to the use of said county.

Approved March 27, 1893.

**Chapter 574.**

An Act to protect Black Bass in Highland Lake and its outlet in Bridgton, Cumberland County.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representative in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Taking of fish in Highland lake in April, May and June, prohibited.

SECT. 1. No person shall take, catch, kill or fish for in any manner, any black bass in the waters of Highland lake or in the waters of the stream or outlet of said lake above the first factory dam thereon, in Bridgton in the county of Cumberland, during the months of April, May and June, under a penalty of ten dollars' fine or thirty days' imprisonment, upon complaint and conviction before any trial justice in the county of Cumberland.

Penalty.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
