· Chapter 593

An Act additional to the Act to incorporate the Proprietors of the Hallowell Social Library.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Authorized, to hold real and personal estate. SECT. 1. The Proprietors of the Hallowell Social Library, incorporated by an act passed March fifteen, eighteen hundred sixty-one, are hereby authorized to take and hold real and personal estate not exceeding fifty thousand dollars, and by vote of a majority of the shareholders at a meeting duly called, may change the name of said corporation, and take such other measures, and perform such other acts as may be deemed by them to be needful, in order to establish a free library in said Hallowell.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 594.

An Act to incorporate the Lawry Dam Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Corporators.

Corporate name.

SECT. 1. S. T. Lawry, F. P. Wing and Jewett Pratt, their associates and assigns are hereby incorporated under the name of the Lawry Dam Company with all the powers and privileges of similar corporations.

May build dam and improve river. SECT. 2. Said corporation is hereby empowered and authorized to build a dam, remove rocks and make all other necessary improvements in Sheepscot river in the town of Palermo, between the points where Sheepscot river emerges from Sheepscot great pond and a point not more than one mile below following the river, to facilitate the driving of logs and lumber down the same, and for this purpose said corporation may take land and materials necessary for the construction of said dam and to make said improvements. And if the parties cannot agree upon the damages, the corporation shall pay the proprietors of the land and materials, so taken, such damages as shall be ascertained and determined by the county commissioners of the county of Waldo in

Damages, how ascertained in case of disagreement.
