## CHAP. 649

First meeting,  
how called.

SECT. 10. The first meeting of said corporation shall be called in the manner provided in the revised statutes, chapter forty-six, section three.

SECT. 11. This act shall take effect when approved.

Approved March 29, 1893.

### Chapter 649.

An Act to provide in part for the Expenditures of Government.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:*

SECT. 1. In order to provide for the several acts and resolves of the legislature, requiring the payment of money from the treasury, and also provide for the necessary expenditures of government for the current fiscal year of eighteen hundred and ninety-three, the following sums are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury, and the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, is authorized, at any time prior to the first day of January next, to draw his warrant on the treasurer for the same:

### Chapter 650.

An Act to provide for the Expenditures of Government for the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. In order to provide for the several acts and resolves of the legislature, requiring the payment of money from the treasury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of government for the year eighteen hundred and ninety-four, the following sums are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury, and the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, is authorized, at any time between the first day of January, eighteen hundred and ninety-four, and the first day of January, eighteen hundred and ninety-five, to draw his warrant on the treasury for the same.
