Chapter 136.

Resolve in aid of the Temporary Home for Women and Children.

Resolved, That the sum of two thousand dollars be, and hereby is appropriated for the use of the Temporary Home for Women and Children at Deering, of which one thousand dollars shall be paid during the year eighteen hundred and ninety-three, and one thousand dollars during the year eighteen hundred and ninety-four.

Chapter 137.

Resolve in favor of the Lewiston Woman's Christian Temperance Union in aid of the Children's Home of Lewiston.

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred dollars be and hereby is appropriated to be paid to the Lewiston Christian Temperance Union for the support of the children's home, established by said association in the city of Lewiston.

Chapter 138.

Resolve in favor of town of Clinton.

Resolved, That there be paid by the treasurer of state, out of the school funds of the current year, to the town of Clinton, the sum of two hundred forty-five dollars and ninety-two cents, it being a balance equitably due said town as its proportion of the school funds for the year eighteen hundred ninety-two.

Chapter 139.

Resolve relating to the duties of the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Resolved, That the commissioner of the Bureau of Industrial and Labor Statistics be instructed to make a special investigation into the extent, location, description and pecuniary results to the state of the summer resorts of the state, and report the same in his next annual report.
