CHAP. 140**Chapter 140.**

Resolve in favor of Joseph P. Sepsis.

Joseph P. Sepsis,
in favor of.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred dollars be, and the same hereby is appropriated to pay Joseph P. Sepsis, representative of the Passamaquoddy tribe of Indians for his travel and attendance at this session of the legislature.

Chapter 141.

Resolve in favor of Joseph Nicolar.

Joseph Nicolar,
in favor of.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred dollars be, and the same is hereby appropriated to pay Joseph Nicolar, representative to the legislature from the Penobscot tribe of Indians for his travel and attendance to this session of the legislature.

Chapter 142.

Resolve in favor of the Maine Eye and Ear Infirmary.

Maine Eye and
Ear Infirmary,
in favor of.

Resolved, That there be and is hereby appropriated the sum of ten thousand dollars, of which five thousand dollars shall be paid during the year eighteen hundred and ninety-three, and five thousand dollars during the year eighteen hundred and ninety-four, for the use of said institution.

Chapter 143.

Resolve in favor of the City of Bangor.

City of Bangor,
in favor of.

Resolved, That there be paid by the treasurer of state, out of the school funds of the current year, to the city of Bangor, the sum of eight hundred forty-eight dollars and ninety-eight cents; it being a balance equitably due said city as its proportion of the school funds for the year eighteen hundred ninety-one.
