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**Chapter 180.**

Resolve relating to the School Lots so called, of the several Plantations and unorganized townships of the State.

*Resolved*, That the land agent be directed to cause to be located the school lot or lots so called in each of the organized plantations, or unorganized townships of the state that are ever likely to be organized, where said school lots were reserved in the conveyance of the land of the several townships, and to prepare a complete record of the location of all such reserved lots of the state.

**Chapter 181.**

Resolve in favor of continuing the publication of York Deeds.

*Resolved*, That the Maine Historical Society agreeing to supervise the copying, attesting, editing, indexing and publishing of volumes nine and ten of the public records of this state, in the office of the register of deeds for York county, in the same creditable manner as in the eight preceding volumes already published, except that they are not required to be leaded, because of their increased size, the governor and council shall purchase for the state four hundred and fifty copies of volume nine, a like number of volume ten at five dollars per volume; and the state librarian shall cause one copy of each volume to be placed in each registry of deeds in this state, the remaining copies to be distributed or exchanged at the discretion of said librarian.
