CHAP. 202**Chapter 202.**

Resolve in favor of Miss Fannie L. Jenkins of Newport.

Fannie L.

Resolved, That Miss Fannie L. Jenkins of Newport be granted a state pension of eight dollars per month, said pension to commence on January first, eighteen hundred ninety-three and continue during the pleasure of the legislature.

Chapter 203.

Resolve in aid of building a road in Jerusalem Township in Franklin County.

Road in Jerusa-

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred dollars be, and the same is hereby appropriated to be expended under the direction of the county commissioners of Franklin county in building a road in Jerusalem township in said county.

Chapter 204.

Resolve in relation to certain settlers' lots in Wallagrass Plantation.

Wallagrass plan-
tation, titles to
lots in.

Resolved, That the attorney general be, and hereby is directed to inquire into the titles of certain settlers' lots in Wallagrass plantation, now claimed by the Pingree heirs and others, and report the facts to the governor and council.

Chapter 205.

Resolves authorizing a temporary loan for the year eighteen hundred and ninety-three.

Temporary loan,
authorized.

Resolved, That to provide for the wants of the treasury, the treasurer of state be, and is hereby authorized to procure on the faith of the state, if he shall deem it necessary, at any time during the year eighteen hundred and ninety-three, a temporary loan of three hundred thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be needed.

Resolved, That the treasurer of state be, and hereby is authorized to give notes in behalf of the state, payable within two years from the date hereof, for such portions of the loan hereby authorized as may be required.

Chapter 206.

Resolve in favor of the committee appointed by this Legislature to attend the funeral of the late Honorable William Wirt Virgin.

Resolved, That the state treasurer be directed to pay to George M. Seiders, chairman of the committee, the sum of eighty-seven dollars and twenty-five cents, same being the amount paid out for expenses of the committee in attending the funeral of the late Honorable William Wirt Virgin at Portland, Maine, in accordance with the order of this legislature.

Chapter 207.

Resolve providing for State Pensions for invalid Soldiers and Sailors who served on the quota of Maine, in the war of eighteen hundred and sixty-one, their widows and orphans and the dependent children, parents and sisters of Soldiers and Sailors.

Resolved, That the sum of sixty-five thousand dollars be and is hereby appropriated to provide for state pensions for invalid soldiers and sailors who served in the war of eighteen hundred and sixty-one, on the quota of Maine, their widows and orphans and the dependent children, parents and sisters of soldiers and sailors for the year eighteen hundred and ninety-three, and sixty thousand dollars for the year eighteen hundred and ninety-four.
