Chapter 235.

Resolves in relation to the Maine Insane Hospital.

Insane Hospital, in relation to. Resolved, That the governor and council and trustees of the Maine Insane Hospital be and are hereby directed to take into consideration the condition of that portion of the patients of the insane hospital, that may appear to belong to an idiotic and demented class, who are entirely incurable, particularly those that are harmless, with a view to separate such class of persons from the hospital, in order that the accommodations of the hospital may meet the present and future demands of insane persons, by the withdrawal of the first class from the hospital to their proper home or asylum.

Resolved, That the governor and council and trustees of the Maine Insane Hospital are further directed, first, to ascertain the exact number of the idiotic and demented persons now in the hospital, and to report their condition, and to further examine into the expediency of constructing additional wings or buildings, and the cost of the same, for the accommodation for the above class, on the grounds of the Maine Insane Hospital, in Augusta, and report to the next legislature.

Approved March 29, 1893.

Chapter 236.

Resolve providing for the Payment of the Contingent Expenses of the Legislature.

Contingent expenses of legislature, in favor of. Resolved, That there be paid from the treasury to the secretary of the senate, for furnishing daily papers to the members and officers of the senate, to members and officers of the house of representatives, and to the executive council, during the present session; for advertising for the legislature and executive council, and for postage and transportation of mail and documents for the senate and house of representatives, the sum of four thousand six hundred and fifty dollars.
