Chapter 2.

An Act to repeal chapter eighty-seven of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-one, entitled "An Act Relating to Fraternal Beneficiary Organizations."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Ch. 87, Public
Laws of 1891,
repealed.

SECT. 1. Chapter eighty-seven of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-one, entitled "An Act Relating to Fraternal Beneficiary Organizations," is hereby repealed.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 3.

An Act to amend section one hundred and twenty-two of chapter two hundred and sixty-six of the Public Laws of one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, relating to the Militia.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sec. 122, ch.
266, Public
Laws of 1893,
amended.

SECT. 1. Section one hundred and twenty-two of chapter two hundred and sixty-six of the Public Laws of one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three is amended by striking out the word "twelfth" in the fourth line thereof, and inserting in place thereof the word 'tenth' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

'SECT. 122. For the purpose of raising revenue to defray the current expenses of the National Guard, there shall be assessed and collected as other state taxes are, a tax of one tenth of one mill upon all property in the state subject to taxation, for the present fiscal year and for each fiscal year thereafter. The revenue raised under the provisions of this section shall be paid into the state treasury and be converted into a special military fund, from which special fund only shall be paid the expenses authorized by this act; and so much thereof as may be necessary is hereby appropriated to carry out the provisions hereof, to be paid upon vouchers approved as provided in section one hundred and seven.'

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
