Chapter 55.

An Act to amend section two of chapter one hundred and thirty-four of the Public Laws of one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven, relating to the Fortnightly Payment of Wages.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sec. 2, ch. 134,
Public Laws
of 1887,
amended.

Section two of chapter one hundred and thirty-four of the public laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven, is hereby amended by adding thereto the words 'by any employe to whom wages is then due,' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

Penalty for
violation.

'SECT. 2. Any corporation violating any of the provisions of this act, shall be punished by a fine not less than ten nor more than twenty-five dollars on each complaint under which it is convicted, provided, complaint for such violation is made within thirty days from the date thereof, by any employe to whom wages is then due.'

Chapter 56.

An Act to amend section sixty-nine of chapter six of the Revised Statutes, relating to Taxes on Lands in places not incorporated.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sec. 69, ch. 6,
R. S.,
amended.

SECT. 1. Section sixty-nine of chapter six of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the words, 'the state assessors shall make lists thereof with as many divisions as will secure equitable taxation, conforming as near as convenient to known divisions and separate ownership and report the same to each successive legislature,' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

Lands in
places not in-
corporated,
may be taxed
by the state.

'SECT. 69. Lands not exempt, and not liable to be assessed in any town, may be taxed by the legislature for a just proportion of all state and county taxes as herein provided for ordering the state and county taxes upon property liable to be assessed in towns. The state assessors shall make lists thereof, with as many divisions as will secure equitable taxation, conforming as near as convenient to known divisions

and separate ownership and report the same to each successive legislature.’ CHAP. 57

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 57.

An Act entitled “An Act to regulate the taking of Salmon and Shad in Orange river, Whiting, Washington County.”

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

All persons shall be allowed to take any salmon, shad or alewives in the waters of Orange river, in the town of Whiting, in the county of Washington, up to one hundred and thirty yards of the fish way at the lower dam in said river, subject, however, to all the laws of the state, and laws regulating the taking of such fish in said river.

Taking of salmon, etc., in town of Whiting, regulated.

Chapter 58.

An Act to amend section twenty of chapter thirty of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter forty-eight of the Public Laws of one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, relating to the killing of Muskrats.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. Section twenty of chapter thirty of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter forty-eight of the public laws of one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, is hereby amended by adding to said section twenty the following words: ‘This section shall not apply to Lily pond, situated in the towns of Rockport and Camden, and it shall be lawful to kill muskrats in said pond during all seasons of the year.’ So that said section as amended, shall read :

Sec. 20, ch. 30, R. S., as amended by ch. 48, Public Laws of 1891, further amended.

‘SECT. 20. Whoever between the first day of May and the fifteenth day of October, destroys any mink, beaver, sable, otter, fisher, or whoever destroys any muskrat between the twentieth day of May and the first day of March, forfeits ten dollars for each animal so destroyed, to be recovered on com-

Penalty for destroying certain fur bearing animals, between May 1 and Oct. 16.
—muskrat, between May 1 and March 1.
