### Chapter 57.

An Act entitled "An Act to regulate the taking of Salmon and Shad in Orange river, Whiting, Washington County."

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

All persons shall be allowed to take any salmon, shad or alewives in the waters of Orange river, in the town of Whiting, in the county of Washington, up to one hundred and thirty yards of the fish way at the lower dam in said river, subject, however, to all the laws of the state, and laws regulating the taking of such fish in said river.

Taking of salmon, etc., in town of Whiting, regulated.

### Chapter 58.

An Act to amend section twenty of chapter thirty of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter forty-eight of the Public Laws of one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, relating to the killing of Muskrats.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. Section twenty of chapter thirty of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter forty-eight of the public laws of one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, is hereby amended by adding to said section twenty the following words: 'This section shall not apply to Lily pond, situated in the towns of Rockport and Camden, and it shall be lawful to kill muskrats in said pond during all seasons of the year.' So that said section as amended, shall read :

Sec. 20, ch. 30, R. S., as amended by ch. 48, Public Laws of 1891, further amended.

SECT. 20. Whoever between the first day of May and the fifteenth day of October, destroys any mink, beaver, sable, otter, fisher, or whoever destroys any muskrat between the twentieth day of May and the first day of March, forfeits ten dollars for each animal so destroyed, to be recovered on com-

plaint. This section shall not apply to Lily pond situated in the towns of Rockport and Camden, and it shall be lawful to kill muskrats in said pond during all seasons of the year.'

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

### Chapter 59.

An Act additional to section twenty-one of chapter forty-one of the Revised Statutes, regulating sales of Lumber.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Failure to  
survey lumber  
and give

thereof, shall  
not defeat

brought to  
recover price

In any action hereafter brought for the price of boards, plank, timber, joists, shingles, clapboards, staves or hoops, unless sold by the cargo, any failure to survey, measure, view or cull and brand the same and to give certificate thereof as required by section twenty-one of chapter forty-one of the revised statutes, shall not defeat recovery in such action, unless it appears that before delivery the purchaser requested such survey, measurement, view or culling, and branding and certificate.

### Chapter 60.

An Act to amend chapter twenty-one of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven, entitled 'An Act to amend chapter two hundred and eighty of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five, entitled "An Act amendatory to section twenty-nine of chapter ninety-one of the Revised Statutes, relating to Liens."'

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Section twenty-nine of chapter ninety-one of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and eighty of the public laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five as amended by chapter twenty-one of the public laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven, is hereby further amended by adding after the word "cutting" in the second line of said section, as amended, the words 'or yarding,' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows :
