CHAP. 59
Lily pond,
excepted.

plaint. This section shall not apply to Lily pond situated in the towns of Rockport and Camden, and it shall be lawful to kill muskrats in said pond during all seasons of the year.'

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 59.

An Act additional to section twenty-one of chapter forty-one of the Revised Statutes, regulating sales of Lumber.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Failure to survey lumber and give certificate thereof, shall not defeat action brought to recover price of same

In any action hereafter brought for the price of boards, plank, timber, joists, shingles, clapboards, staves or hoops, unless sold by the cargo, any failure to survey, measure, view or cull and brand the same and to give certificate thereof as required by section twenty-one of chapter forty-one of the revised statutes, shall not defeat recovery in such action, unless it appears that before delivery the purchaser requested such survey, measurement, view or culling, and branding and certificate.

Chapter 60.

An Act to amend chapter twenty-one of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven, entitled 'An Act to amend chapter two hundred and eighty of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five, entitled "An Act amendatory to section twenty-nine of chapter ninety-one of the Revised Statutes, relating to Liens."'

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Sec. 29, ch. 91, R. S., as amended by ch. 280, Public Laws of 1885, as amended by ch. 21, Public Laws of 1887 amended.

Section twenty-nine of chapter ninety-one of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter two hundred and eighty of the public laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-five as amended by chapter twenty-one of the public laws of eighteen hundred and eighty-seven, is hereby further amended by adding after the word "cutting" in the second line of said section, as amended, the words 'or yarding,' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows :

'SECT. 29. Whoever labors at cutting and peeling or yarding hemlock bark, or cutting or yarding cord wood, or at cooking for persons engaged in such labor, has a lien thereon for the amount due for his personal services and the services performed by his team, which takes precedence of all other claims, continues for thirty days after the contract is completed, and may be enforced by attachment; provided, however, that such lien shall not continue after the bark or wood has arrived at a market.'

Chapter 61.

An Act relating to Gaslight Companies.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

All gaslight companies in this state which are authorized to furnish gas for lighting are hereby further authorized to furnish gas for heating and for power and proper appliances therefor, under the same conditions and with the same rights as they are now authorized to furnish gas for lighting purposes.

Gas companies authorized to furnish gas for power.

Chapter 62.

An Act authorizing steam railroads to use Electricity as motive power.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Railroad corporations which are subject to the provisions of chapter fifty-one of the revised statutes, and amendments thereto, are hereby authorized to operate their railroads by electricity.

R. R. corporations authorized to operate their roads by electricity.
