Chapter 75.

An Act to amend section one hundred and eight of chapter eleven of the Revised Statutes, relating to Normal Schools.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Amend by inserting in the last line of said section one hundred and eight, the words 'or four,' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

The course of study shall occupy two years Two years' 'SECT. 108. with suitable vacations, and with the terms of admission shall be managed by said superintendent, subject to the approval dent. of the governor and council. The trustees may arrange for a course of study, occupying three or four years, for such students as may elect to pursue the same.'

Chapter 76.

An Act authorizing the appointment of Special Insurance Brokers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sect. 1.
