of probate shall make out and certify a true copy thereof to the register of deeds for the county in which the lands lie, and be binding, to all intents and purposes, upon all the persons interested, saving the right of appeal to the supreme court of probate.’

Chapter 109.

An Act to amend section nine of chapter ninety-five of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-one, as amended by chapter two hundred fifty of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-three, to prohibit the killing of cow moose and fixing an additional penalty for killing bull moose, caribou and deer in close time.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Section nine of chapter ninety-five of the public laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-one, as amended by chapter two hundred and fifty of the public laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-three is hereby amended as follows: By striking out all of said section after the word “dog” in the second line, and inserting the following words, ‘jack lights, so called, torches, traps or snares, any bull moose, or in any manner hunts, catches, kills, destroys or has in possession any cow or calf moose, or part thereof, forfeits not less than one hundred nor more than three hundred dollars for every bull moose or cow or calf moose so hunted, caught, killed, destroyed or had in possession, and be imprisoned not exceeding thirty days; and no person shall, between the first days of January and October, in any manner, hunt, catch, kill, destroy or have in possession any bull moose, or any part thereof, taken in close time, under the same penalty,’ so that said section, as amended, shall read as follows :

‘SECT. 9. Whoever hunts, catches, kills or destroys with dogs, jack lights, so called, snares or traps, any bull moose, or in any manner hunts, catches, kills, destroys or has in possession any cow or calf moose, or part thereof, forfeits not less than one hundred nor more than three hundred dollars for every bull moose or cow or calf moose so hunted, caught, killed, destroyed or had in possession and be imprisoned thirty days; and no person shall, between the first days of

CHAP. 110 January and October, in any manner, hunt, catch, kill, destroy or have in possession any bull moose, or any part thereof, taken in close time, under the same penalty.'

Hunting at all between Jan. 1 and Oct. 1, prohibited.

Chapter 110.

An Act to further amend an act entitled, "An Act to amend section two of chapter two hundred forty-two of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred ninety-three, relating to Free Public Libraries," approved February twenty-three, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred ninety-five.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Act approved Feb. 23, 1895, amended.

The act to amend an act entitled, "An Act to amend section two of chapter two hundred forty-two of the public laws of eighteen hundred ninety-three," approved February twenty-three, in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred ninety-five, is hereby further amended by striking out after the words "certify to the," the words "state treasurer," and inserting in place thereof the words 'governor and council'; also, by striking out after the words "and the," the words "state treasurer thereupon shall pay to said town from the state treasury," and inserting in place thereof the words 'governor, with the advice and consent of the council, shall draw a warrant on the state treasurer'; also, by inserting after the word "library" and before "a," the word 'for'; so that said section as amended, shall read as follows :

State shall annually pay ten per cent of amount expended by any town, for support of public library.

'SECT. 2. The municipal officers in any town or city where a free public library is established, shall annually, on the first day of May, certify to the governor and council the amount of money appropriated and expended by said town or city during the preceding year, for the purchase of books and documents for the use and benefit of such free public library, and for the payment of the running expenses thereof; and the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, shall draw a warrant on the state treasurer for the purchase of books for the use of such library, for a sum equal to ten per cent of the amount expended by said town, as certified by its municipal officers.'
