CHAP. 128

purpose of gaining information and the proper enforcement of the fishery law.

Compensation
of wardens.

SECT. 6. The compensation of the wardens shall be two dollars per day and expenses when actually employed.

Chapter 128.

An Act to fix the salary of the Judge of Probate for York County.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Salary of
judge of pro-
bate, York Co.,
fixed.

SECT. 1. From and after the first day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, the salary of the judge of probate for the county of York shall be one thousand dollars per year instead of the sum now fixed by law.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 129.

An Act relating to actions for torts or injuries suffered on the Lord's day.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Actions for
injury
received on
Lord's day.

SECT. 1. The provisions of chapter one hundred twenty-four of the revised statutes relating to the observance of the Lord's day, shall not affect in any way the rights or remedy of either party in any action for a tort or injury suffered on that day.

Act shall not
apply to pend-
ing actions.

SECT. 2. This act shall not apply to, or affect any action now pending nor any action hereafter brought for any cause which shall have arisen at the date of the approval of this act.
