#### GAME BIRDS.

time, the fish may have a free and unobstructed passage CHAP. 149 through said weir or other structure, and no contrivance which tends to hinder such fish, shall be placed in any part thereof. If the enclosure where the fish are taken, is furnished with a board floor, an opening extending from the floor to the top of the weir is equivalent to one extending from the bottom to the top. The penalty for the violation of this section is twenty dollars for each offense. This section does not apply to the Kennebec, Androscoggin or Penob- --close time scot rivers or their tributaries, or to the Aroostook river and to certain rivers. its tributaries.'

SECT. 3. The above section does not apply to the Penobscot and Belfast bays.

#### Chapter 149.

An Act to prohibit the taking or killing certain Game Birds for a term of years.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

It shall be unlawful for a term of five years to SECT. 1. SECT. 1. It shall be unlawful for a term of five years to hunt for, take, catch, kill or destroy any of the following black game, named birds under a penalty of fifty dollars for the offense, hive years. and twenty-five dollars for each bird so taken, caught, killed \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ or destroyed. The capercailzie, or cock of the woods, so called, black game, so called, or any species of the pheasant, except the partridge, so called.

All fines and penalties under this act, shall be Penalties, how SECT. 2. enforced in the same manner, as for the violation of laws relating to the illegal killing of game.
