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**CHAP. 2** made in said crossings by said company, then said last mentioned crossings shall become legal and sufficient crossings.

Co. shall file lists of crossings with clerks of courts.

SECT. 2. Said railroad company shall cause to be filed with the clerk of courts of each county, through which said railroad passes, a list of the said crossings in the respective county, and endorsed thereon shall be a copy of said approval of the railroad commissioners, duly certified to be such by the clerk of said railroad commissioners, and the same shall be entered at length upon the records of such counties.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

## Chapter 2.

An Act to change the name of the Moosehead Lake Telegraph Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled as follows :*

Name changed to Northern Telegraph Co.

SECT. 1. The name of Moosehead Lake Telegraph Company, chartered by an act of the legislature approved March one, eighteen hundred and seventy-nine, is hereby changed to that of the Northern Telegraph Company. Nothing herein contained shall affect the rights or liabilities of said corporation.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

## Chapter 3.

An Act to repeal sections ten, eleven, and fifteen of chapter four hundred eighty-nine of the Private and Special Laws for the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Kennebec Dam Company."

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Charter of Kennebec Dam Co., amended.

SECT. 1. Sections ten, eleven and fifteen of chapter four hundred and eighty-nine of the private and special laws for the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Kennebec Dam Company," are hereby repealed.

SECT. 2. All acts and parts of acts requiring the erection, maintenance and operation of a lock, or locks, in the Kennebec dam, across the Kennebec river at Augusta, are hereby repealed.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

### Chapter 4.

An Act to enlarge the powers of the Monson Maine Slate Company.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

The Monson Maine Slate Company created under the general law for manufacturing corporations, May twenty-second, eighteen hundred and eighty-three, as per certificate of organization recorded in the office of the secretary of state, volume six, page two hundred and sixty-three, and volume eight, page one hundred and sixty, is hereby authorized and empowered to buy, hold and sell lands, and quarry and manufacture in any manner and form, and sell slate, and to lease for the same purposes in any part of the state of Maine, in addition to its powers under its charter aforesaid.

### Chapter 5.

An Act to amend Chapter five hundred and sixty-three of the Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-three, relating to the Cape Elizabeth Home for Aged Women.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Chapter five hundred and sixty-three of the special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-three is hereby amended by striking out section two of said chapter, and by inserting after the word "Poland" in the fourth line of section one of said chapter, the words 'and their associates and successors,' so that said section one as amended, shall read as follows :
