PRIVATE AND SPECIAL LAWS

All acts and parts of acts requiring the erection, Chap. maintenance and operation of a lock, or locks, in the Ken- Use of locks discontinued. nebec dam, across the Kennebec river at Augusta, are hereby repealed.

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SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 4.

An Act to enlarge the powers of the Monson Maine Slate Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The Monson Maine Slate Company created under the Powers of Co. general law for manufacturing corporations, May twenty- enlarged. second, eighteen hundred and eighty-three, as per certificate of organization recorded in the office of the secretary of state, volume six, page two hundred and sixty-three, and volume eight, page one hundred and sixty, is hereby authorized and empowered to buy, hold and sell lands, and quarry and manufacture in any manner and form, and sell slate, and to lease for the same purposes in any part of the state of Maine, in addition to its powers under its charter aforesaid.

Chapter 5.

An Act to amend Chapter five hundred and sixty-three of the Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-three, relating to the Cape Elizabeth Home for

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Chapter five hundred and sixty-three of the special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-three is hereby amended by Special Laws of 1893, striking out section two of said chapter, and by inserting amended. after the word "Poland" in the fourth line of section one of said chapter, the words 'and their associates and successors,' so that said section one as amended, shall read as follows:

T. Dyer, Stephen Scamman, Leslie C. Jewell, Emma H. Jewell, and Eliza Poland, and their associates and successors, are hereby constituted a body corporate under the name of the Cape Elizabeth Home for Aged Women, for the purpose of providing a home for certain aged, needy and infirm women at Cape Elizabeth, with all the powers, privileges and immunities conferred, and subject to all the obligations imposed by the laws of this state relating to corporations, except as modified by this act.'

Chapter 6.

An Act amendatory of and additional to "An Act to establish the Old Town Municipal Court."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

City required to provide court room.

—county holden for all other expenses.

Sec. 20, ch. 127, Special Laws, 1887, amended. SECT. 1. The city of Old Town shall provide a properly furnished court room for holding the Old Town municipal court; and said court shall be held therein, and all civil processes of said court shall be made returnable accordingly. All other expenses of said court, except the salary of the judge and of the recorder thereof, shall be paid by the county of Penobscot; and said county shall pay for all court blanks now in the hands of said judge.

SECT. 2. The second paragraph of section twenty of chapter one hundred and seventy-seven of the private and special laws of the state of Maine, enacted in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven is hereby amended by inserting after the word "received" in line seventeen of said section the words in criminal cases, and after the word "Old Town" in line eighteen of said section the words except fees for making copies on orders to recognize and on appeals; and by striking out the words "legal voters of the town of Old Town aforesaid" in lines twelve and thirteen of said section, and inserting instead thereof the words eity council of the city of Old Town; so that said paragraph, as amended, shall read:
