Chapter 13.

An Act to legalize the proceedings by which Coplin Plantation was organized.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The proceedings by which Coplin plantation in Franklin points of county was organized on the tenth day of May, eighteen continuated the made hundred and ninety-three, are hereby confirmed and the organization of said plantation is hereby declared legal and valid.

Approved February 5, 1895.

Chapter 14.

An Act to repeal the act incorporating the town of Kossuth.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECT. 1. The act entitled "An Act to incorporate the town of Kossuth," approved February twenty-three, eighteen incorporation, repealed. hundred and seventy-six, is hereby repealed; provided, however, that the corporate existence, powers, duties and liabilities of said town shall survive for the purpose of prosecuting Corporate existence shall and defending all pending suits and causes of suits to which survive, for certain said town is or may be a party, and for the execution of all purposes. needful processes growing out of the same, and for the further purpose of providing for the payment of all or any judgments which may be recovered against said town.

This act shall take effect when approved. Sect. 2.
