Chapter 15.

An Act to change the name of the Second Universalist Society of Westbrook.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Name of
society
changed, and
doings made
valid.

SECT. 1. The Universalist Society which has its church edifice in Saccarappa, in the city of Westbrook, and has been called and known hitherto by the name of the Second Universalist Society of Westbrook, shall henceforth be called and known by the name of the First Universalist Society of Westbrook, and all its acts and doings in its corporate capacity heretofore, are hereby legalized and made valid.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 16.

An Act to provide in part for the Expenditures of Government.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. In order to provide for the several acts and resolves of the legislature, requiring the payment of money from the treasury, and also to provide for the necessary expenditures of government for the current fiscal year of eighteen hundred and ninety-five, the following sums are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury, and the governor, with the advice and consent of the council, is authorized at any time prior to the first day of January next, to draw his warrant on the treasury for the same.
