CHAP. 34

Co. authorized
to issue bonds
and mortgage
property.

SECT. 2. For the purpose of building and extending its works through Van Buren village, said corporation, when it shall have been duly organized, is hereby authorized from time to time to issue its bonds for such amount as shall be equal to the amount of stock subscribed for, up to that time, and not exceeding in all the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars, bearing interest at a rate not exceeding six per cent per annum, and secured by mortgage upon the property and franchise of said corporation.

Chapter 34.

An Act in aid of the completion of the Saint Croix and Penobscot Railroad.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The city of Calais and its inhabitants may surrender to the Saint Croix and Penobscot Railroad Company, its assigns or trustees, its mortgage held by said city upon said road and all the parts thereof, and may cancel and discharge the city's mortgage, or assign it to said company, or trustee or trustees for said company, at the latter's option, upon condition that said railroad shall be extended and completed to a junction with the Maine Central Railroad near Tomah station in Washington county, prior to the first day of July, eighteen hundred and ninety-seven ; provided, however, that the proposition so to do shall first be submitted to the voters of said city in the manner prescribed by revised statutes, chapter fifty-one, section one hundred and thirty-seven, and a majority of those voting shall vote in the affirmative for said proposition.

SECT. 2. After the approval of said proposition by the voters as aforesaid, the city council shall, upon receiving security for the extension and completion of said railroad as aforesaid, and also for the repair and making of the bridge at Salmon Falls fit to receive the traffic of the Saint Stephens and Milltown Railroad when completed and running, by bond to said city, with good and sufficient sureties, to be approved by majority of the board of aldermen of said city, immediately cause said mortgage to be delivered and paid over to

said Saint Croix and Penobscot Railroad Company, its assigns or trustee or trustees, and said mortgages to be canceled or assigned as aforesaid, as its directors may determine; and said city may do all other things necessary and proper to accomplish the purposes of this act. CHAP. 35

SECT. 3. Said Saint Croix and Penobscot Railroad Company is authorized to receive said mortgage and the assignment of said mortgage and to hold or cancel the same. Railroad authorized to receive mortgage.

Chapter 35.

An Act to amend an act entitled "An Act to incorporate the Dunn Edge Tool Company," approved March thirty-one, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, as amended by chapter seventy-seven of the Private and Special laws of the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Section one of said act is hereby amended by inserting after the word "dollars" in the thirteenth line thereof the following words, viz: 'a portion of which said corporation may invest in the shares of the capital stock of other corporations;' so that said section as amended shall read as follows: Sec. 1, amended.

SECT. 1. Reuben B. Dunn, N. G. H. Pulsifer, James R. Batchelder, their associates and successors, are hereby constituted and made a body corporate by the name of the Dunn Edge Tool Company, for the manufacture of edge tools, and of wood and timber into boxes, and other articles, at Waterville and Fayette, in the county of Kennebec, with all the powers and privileges and subject to all the liabilities provided by the laws of this state concerning manufacturing corporations, and are hereby authorized to purchase and hold real and personal estate not exceeding in value, at any one time, the sum of three hundred and fifty thousand dollars, a portion of which, said corporation may invest in the shares of the capital stock of other corporations. And said corporation may establish such by-laws as they shall deem suitable to carry into effect the purposes and interests of the corporation not repugnant to the laws of the state. Corporators.
