dred and ninety-five, payable to bearer, at such times within CHAP. 40
six years as the county commissioners may appoint.

SECT. 4. Said bonds and coupons shall be signed by the county treasurer, and said bonds shall be countersigned by the county commissioners of said county, and shall be sold by the treasurer at the highest price he can obtain, not less than par; and the proceeds of the same shall be applied for the purposes aforesaid and for none other.

How bonds shall be signed and sold.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 40.

An Act to authorize the town of Caribou to purchase a lot of land upon which to build a Court House, and convey the same to the County of Aroostook.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

The town of Caribou is hereby empowered and authorized to purchase a lot of land in said town at any price not exceeding two thousand dollars for the purposes of a court house and to convey the same, when purchased, under the hand and seal of the treasurer of said town in fee simple, to the county of Aroostook for the purpose of erecting a court house thereon and such other buildings as it may thereafter be deemed expedient by the commissioners of said county to place thereon for the use and purposes of said county, provided, that the inhabitants of said town shall, by a majority vote of those present at a legal meeting called for the purpose, authorize the same.

Town authorized to purchase lot of land for court house.
