#### (PHILLIPS WATER COMPANY-CENTERVILLE.

#### Chapter 43.

An Act to extend the charter of the Phillips Water Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The time within which the Phillips Water Company, char- Charter tered by private and special laws of eighteen hundred and extended to Dec. 31, 1896. ninety-one, chapter one hundred and seventy, may organize and commence actual business is hereby extended to December thirty-one, eighteen hundred and ninety-six. And said charter and the organization of said Phillips Water Company shall be valid, provided, said water company lay at least onehalf mile of water pipe for the purpose of supplying the town of Phillips with water for domestic purposes, on or before said December thirty-one, eighteen hundred and ninety-six.

#### Chapter 44.

An Act to legalize the doings of the town of Centerville in annual town meeting held March thirty-first, eighteen hundred and ninety-four.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

The doings and acts of the town of Centerville Doings of town Sect. 1. in the county of Washington, in meeting held March thirtyone, eighteen hundred and ninety-four, are hereby legalized and made valid; and especially and particularly rectifying and curing the following defects. The constable who posted the warrant calling said meeting did not post the same as required by law; and the acts and doings of said town under said warrant are hereby made legal and valid.

This act shall take effect when approved. SECT. 2.
