Chapter 75.

An Act to amend chapter two hundred eighty-one of the Private and Special Laws of one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, as amended by chapter five hundred seventy of the Private and Special Laws of one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, relating to fishing in McGraw and other ponds in Kennebec county.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Sec. 1, ch. 281, Private Laws of 1801, as amended by ch. 570, Private Laws of 1803, amended. SECT. 1. Section one of chapter two hundred and eightyone of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-one, as amended by chapter five hundred and seventy of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-three, is hereby further amended, so as to read as follows:

Taking of fish from certain ponds, prohibited. 'SECT. 1. No land-locked salmon or trout shall be taken by any person in any way whatever, from any stream tributary to any of the following named ponds situated in the counties of Kennebec and Somerset; McGraw, Ellis, East, North, Great, Long and Snow ponds.'

Sec. 2, amended. SECT. 2. Section two of said chapter two hundred and eighty-one of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-one is hereby amended by inserting after the word "perch" in the first, third, fifth, sixth, seventh lines the words 'or black bass,' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

Taking of white perch and black bass for sale, prohibited. 'SECT. 2. No person shall take any white perch or black bass from either of the ponds or streams named in section one, for the purpose of sale; and any person taking white perch or black bass from either of said ponds or streams in

any manner whatever, for the purposes of sale, or who offers

white perch or black bass so taken for sale, or who sells or in any manner disposes of white perch or black bass so taken, for profit to himself or another, or ships said white perch or black bass so taken to any person outside of this state, shall

How fines may be recovered. sold, offered for sale or shipped, as hereinbefore prohibited. The same to be recovered on complaint before any trial justice, police or municipal court, in either of said counties of

be punished by a fine of ten dollars for each fish so taken,

Kennebec or Somerset, one-half to the complainant and one-half to the county in which said complaint is made.'
