SMELTS.

CHAP. 84 First meeting, how called.

SECT. 5. The first meeting of the corporation may be called by either first three persons named in section one, by written notice to all the members at least seven days before the meeting.

SECT. 6. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 84.

An Act to prevent the destruction of Smelts in the bays, harbors and coves in the town of Surry.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Taking of smelts, by purse or drag seines or weirs, in the town of Surry, prohibited.

Penalty for violation.

SECT. 1. All persons are hereby prohibited from taking any smelts by means of purse, or by drag seines or weirs, or in any other manner, except with hook and line, in any bay, harbor or cove, in the town of Surry in the county of Hancock, commencing at Weymouth point and running south southwest course five miles to Newberry Neck, and from Newberry Neck a north and south course two and one-half miles past Jud's island to the Bluehill line.

SECT. 2. Whoever shall violate the provisions of this act shall on conviction of the same before any municipal court or trial justice of said county of Hancock, be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars nor more than twenty dollars or imprisonment in the county jail for a term not less than ten days, and imprisoned in said jail for same time for non-payment of said fine.
