hereafter described in the town of Otisfield or in any town, plantation, or unincorporated place in Cumberland or Oxford counties, also their respective dwelling houses, stores, shops, barns and other buildings, household furniture, merchandise and other property against loss or damage by fire whether the same happen by accident, lightning or by any other means excepting that of design in the insured and may purchase and hold such real and personal estate as may be necessary to effect the object of this association and may sell and convey the same at pleasure.'

Power to insure in any town in Cumberland or Oxford county.

Chapter 95.

An Act additional to and amendatory of chapter five hundred and eighty-five of the Private and Special Laws of the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Kennebec Water Power Company "

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECT. 1. The provisions of chapter five hundred and eighty-five of the private and special laws of the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Kennebec Water Power Company," are hereby extended and made applicable to Spencer pond, situated in number three, range five, and number four, range six, in Bingham's purchase west of Kennebec river, and to Long pond situated in number three, range four, in Bingham's purchase west of Kennebec river, in the county of Somerset, and a further time of four years from the date of the approval of this act is hereby granted to said corporation for the purpose of commencing and prosecuting the objects of said act of incorporation.

Charter amended, and applicable to other waters.

—extended four years.

SECT. 2. All dams or other structures owned or controlled by said company shall be so constructed with proper roll ways, sluice ways, gates, or other contrivances, and so managed as to facilitate and not impede or interfere with the floating or driving of logs in Kennebec river or its tributaries.

Dams shall not interfere with the driving of logs.
