Chapter 96.

An Act to amend the charter of the Union Safe Deposit and Trust Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

Charter,
amended.

Section seven of the charter of the Union Safe Deposit and Trust Company is hereby amended by adding thereto the following : 'Said corporation may become surety upon any bond required to be given by any party in any matter or proceeding in any court sitting in this state, or by any person holding any position of trust in which a bond is required,' so that said section as amended, shall read as follows :

'SECT. 7. Said corporation may be appointed executor, trustee or assignee, with the same powers and duties as are conferred and imposed by law upon natural persons acting in the same capacities and subject to the same control of the courts having jurisdiction of the same, in all proceedings relating to the exercise of these powers, all papers may be signed and sworn to by any officer designated by the corporation for that purpose, and the officers shall be subject to citation and examination in the same manner and to the same extent as natural persons acting in the same capacities. No sureties shall be required upon the bond of the corporation when acting in said capacities. Said corporation may become surety upon any bond required to be given by any party in any matter or proceeding in any court sitting in this state, or by any person holding any position of trust in which a bond is required.'
