**Chapter 108.**

An Act granting further powers to the Home for Aged Women.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

The Home for Aged Women, already established in the city of Portland, is hereby authorized to take and hold property and estate for the purposes of its organization to an amount not exceeding two hundred thousand dollars ; and all the acts of the corporation relating to the taking and holding of property and estate for the purposes for which the corporation was organized, are hereby legalized and made valid.

Authorized to hold property not exceeding \$200,000.

—acts made valid.

Approved March 5, 1895.

**Chapter 109.**

An Act relating to chapter two hundred and fifty-four of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-one, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Mousam Water Company."

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. The rights, powers and privileges of the Mousam Water Company, granted by chapter two hundred and fifty-four of the private and special laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-one, are hereby extended for and during the term of two years from March nineteen, eighteen hundred and ninety-five.

Charter extended, two years.

SECT. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
