Chapter 135.

An Act providing that the school committee of the town of Castine may be authorized to make arrangements with the principal of the Eastern Maine State Normal School, whereby students of said normal school, may practice the art of teaching in one or more of the schools of said town.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Students may practice teaching in town schools. SECT. 1. The legal voters of the town of Castine in the county of Hancock, may, by a majority vote, at any legally called meeting, authorize its school committee to make arrangements with the principal of Eastern State Normal School by which students of the said normal school may teach in one or more of the schools of said town, under charge of the teachers employed by said town.

Schools shall remain under control of town.

- SECT. 2. The said schools shall be, as now, under the control of said town of Castine.
 - SECT. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 136.

An Act to incorporate the Sahattus Water Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Corporators.

Corporate name.

—purposes, powers, and privileges. SECT. 1. Charles Bigelow, J. Frank Vose, Charles A. Dinsmore, Charles A. Amback and P. J. Sweeney, with their associates and successors, are hereby made a corporation by the name of the Sabattus Water Company, for the purpose of supplying the village of Sabattus, in the towns of Webster and Greene and in the city of Lewiston east of Lewiston old line, in the county of Androscoggin and state of Maine and vicinity, with pure water for domestic, sanitary, industrial and municipal purposes, including the extinguishment of fires. And such corporation shall possess all the powers and privileges, and be subject to all the liabilities and obligations imposed upon corporations by law, except as herein otherwise provided.

Location.

SECT. 2. The place of business of said corporation shall be at the village of Sabattus, in the town of Webster, in the county of Androscoggin; and its business shall be confined
