CHAP. 163

vaults of said bank, shall be subject to the approval of the state bank examiner, who shall make careful examination and certify his approval to said bank before said boxes shall be rented.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 163.

An Act to authorize the town of Fort Fairfield to fund its indebtedness at maturity and to issue new bonds.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Town authorized to fund debt. SECT. 1. The town of Fort Fairfield is hereby authorized to fund its indebtedness at maturity and for this purpose to issue bonds, in such form and amount, and with such rates of interest, and payable at such times and in such manner as shall be determined by vote of said town, under a proper article in the warrant at a legal town meeting; provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall authorize any increase in the indebtedness of said town.

—indebtedness shall not be increased.

Authorized to pass votes to carry act into effect.

SECT. 2. To carry into effect the provisions of this act, said town is hereby authorized to pass such votes, as may be deemed necessary and proper, to enter into and make any contract or agreement not inconsistent with the laws of this state.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
