**Chapter 164.**

An Act to authorize the sale of the Union Meeting House in Winslow.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :*

SECT. 1. The trustees of the Union society or parish in Winslow, in the county of Kennebec, are hereby authorized and empowered to sell and convey at public auction or private sale the Union meeting house, so called, in said Winslow, together with the land, furniture and fixtures belonging thereto.

Trustees authorized to sell meeting house in Winslow.

SECT. 2. If said trustees decide to sell said meeting house at public auction, they shall cause written notice of the time and place of such sale to be posted in three public and conspicuous places in the town of Winslow at least fourteen days before said sale, and shall also cause said notice to be published three weeks successively before said sale in the Waterville Mail, published in the city of Waterville.

How notice shall be given if sold at auction.

SECT. 3. The said trustees shall first pay from the proceeds of said sale all incidental expenses, and such debts as they shall be satisfied are equitably due from the proprietors or pew owners of said meeting house, and the balance of the proceeds of said sale shall be divided proportionately to their interest in said property among such of the proprietors and pew owners thereof, as shall within one year of said sale claim their proportional dividend.

How proceeds shall be divided.

SECT. 4. Said trustees shall within thirty days after said sale, by publication three weeks successively in the Waterville Mail, and by posting a like notice in three public and conspicuous places in the town of Winslow, give notice that said sale has been perfected and that all persons claiming any interest in the proceeds thereof may forthwith give notice of their claim to said trustees. Said trustees shall keep a list of said claimants and at the end of said year divide said balance, pro rata, among said claimants; and all claims not so presented within said one year shall be forever barred.

Claimants shall have notice that sale has been perfected.

—when claims shall be barred.

SECT. 5. This act shall take effect when approved.
